1 Month	DTaP-IPV-Hib (Diphtheria, Tetanus, acellular Pertussis, inactivated Polio & Haemophilus influenzae type b) Pneumococcal conjugate 13 Rotavirus
4 Months	DTaP-IPV-Hib (Diphtheria, Tetanus, acellular Pertussis, inactivated Polio & Haemophilus influenzae type b) Pneumococcal conjugate 13 Rotavirus
6 Months	DTaP-IPV-Hib (Diphtheria, Tetanus, acellular Pertussis, inactivated Polio & Haemophilus influenzae type b) Rotavirus
12 Months	MMRV (Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella) Meningococcal conjugate C Pneumococcal conjugate 13 Hepatitis A (for children living on reserves and select Northern communities)

4-6 Years	Tdap-IPV (Tetanus, Diphtheria, acellular Pertussis, inactivated Polio)
Grade 6	Hepatitis B Meningococcal conjugate ACYW-135 HPV-9 (Human Papillomavirus - 9 types) Varicella
Grade 8	Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, acellular Pertussis)
6 months to 17 years	Influenza - recommended every year
Adult Immunization Schedule	
18 years and older	Influenza - recommended every year Td (Tetanus, Diphtheria) - every 10 years Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, acellular Pertussis) - should replace one of the Td doses MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) - 2 doses for those born since January 1, 1970 Polio - 3 doses for eligible adults Varicella - 2 doses for eligible adults
65 years and older Some people are eligible to receive these vaccines. Check with a Public Health Nurse.	Pneumococcal polysaccharide 23 (one lifetime dose) Hepatitis A Hepatitis B Meningococcal conjugate ACYW-135 Meningococcal B Pneumococcal conjugate 13 Pneumococcal polysaccharide 23
